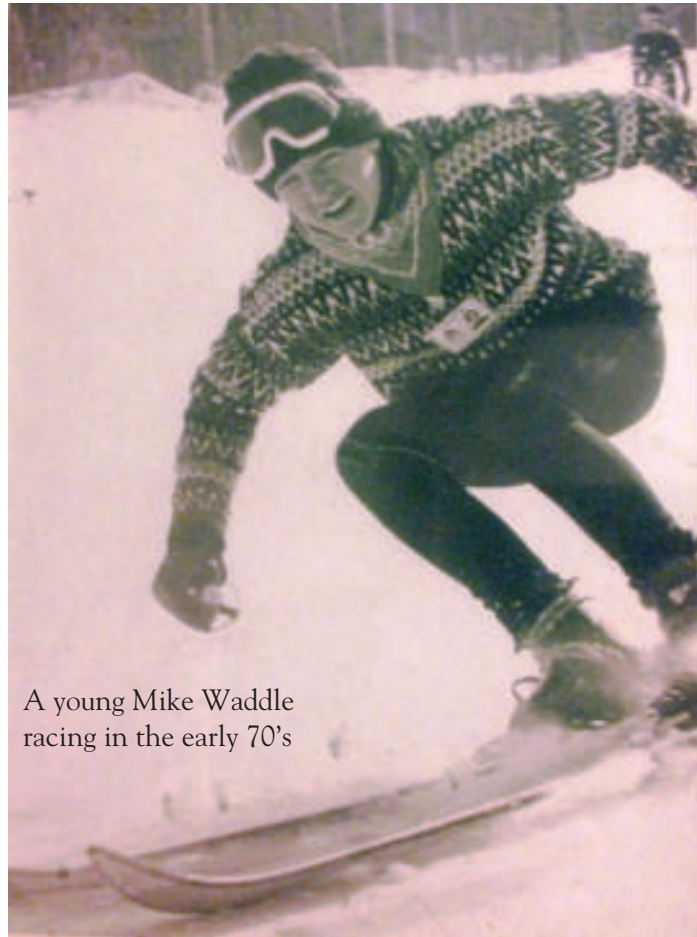

36th Annual McKay/Waddle Scholarship Races

Monday, February 20th (President's Day) is the scheduled date for this year's races in memory of Dan McKay and Mike Waddle. This 2-run Giant Slalom format fun race for all ages is held each year with the proceeds going to the Sugarloaf Regional Ski Educational Foundation's McKay/Waddle scholarship fund. This fund was established to honor their memory and to help young ski and snowboard competitors defray the costs of travel expenses and entry fees.

The fund was started in the early 1980's by the families of Dan McKay and Mike Waddle, two young Alpine racers who died tragically in separate accidents. Dan and Mike were good friends as well as competitors who trained with the Sugarloaf Junior Racing program and raced throughout the state of Maine and New England. They exemplified the "spirit of Sugarloaf" with their determination and style. Both Mike and Dan were avid speed racers competing in many Down-

hill events. Even though they skied very fast and were always on the edge, this was not the cause of the accidents that took their lives while they were young men. Dan died in a

courageous and crazy young men that their legacies live on. Thus, the McKay/Waddle Scholarship Fund was started in the spring of 1982 with a fun race on Lower Competition Hill to benefit others.

It was and still is important to the families of these courageous and crazy young men that their legacies live on.

For all you youngsters and not-so-youngsters, please come out and enjoy a few hours of racing and a great BBQ lunch at the Jean Luce building. All prizes for competitors will be randomly drawn in bib raffle style and the first 100 folks who sign up will receive a uniquely designed commemorative t-shirt. 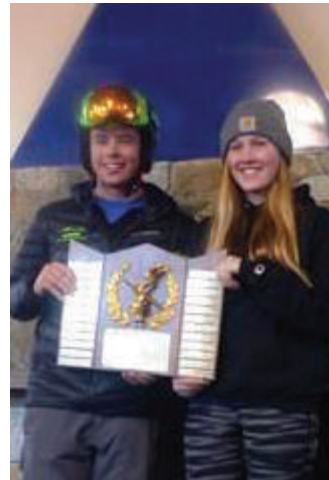

The Rand Stowell Alpine Ski Race

Next to the Sugarloaf Schuss, the 'Rand Stowell' is the longest continuously run ski race held at Sugarloaf. It was created in 1969 to honor Sugarloaf Founder and longtime ski club member Rand Stowell.

The competition is a high level Eastern Division race and many of the winners have gone on to become members of the U S Alpine Ski Team. Sugarloafers Gail Blackburn and Tim Skaling were the first to win this prestigious event. Both went on to become members of the U S Ski Team.

This year's Rand Stowell was a Downhill run at the end of January. Sugarloaf Ski Club member Sam Conzelman won for the ladies and Bobby Ryan from Killington Mountain School won for the men.

Stowell Trophy Inaugurated December 12, 1969

The Sugarloaf Mountain Ski Club has established an annual ski race for all U.S.E.A.S.A. classified junior competitors to be held during the Christmas vacation training camp. Maurice Skaling, Ski Club President, is pleased to announce the Rand Stowell Trophy will be awarded to the overall winner and a permanent plaque will be displayed in the Sugarloaf trophy case with each yearly recipient recorded.

The Rand. Stowell Trophy Race will be held on Dec. 28th at 10 am on the recut Narrow Gauge trail. The giant slalom event is open to all junior class 1-4 boys and girls. Entries and fee must be mailed to Mrs. Maryanne Pfeifle, Kingfield, Maine 04947, by December 21st.

The late Rand Stowell of Dixfield, Maine was a prominent race official at all sanctioned ski events at Sugarloaf and Farmington. He was an active member of the Sugarloaf Mountain Corporation board of directors from its inception in 1955 until his death in 1968. His family has always been active in supporting ski competition. His wife, Phoebe, is often recording on the scoreboard at the finish gate, and son John has been an active competitor. His son, Richard, has been an active ski instructor in the Junior Program at Hanover, N.H. during his school years. Another Stowell, a niece Mary, was an outstanding junior competitor in Maine races.

This was a press release from 1969. Rand's grandchildren continued the racing tradition. One grandchild, Nora Stowell, attended CVA. The Stowell family has played an integral role in CVA and the Sugarloaf Ski Club.

Multiple CVA Athletes Compete in Snowboard Cross World Cup Event

First Time in School History

In late January, Carrabassett Valley Academy sent four enrolled athletes to compete in the World Cup Boardercross events at Solitude Mountain, UT. This marked the first time in school history that multiple athletes had simultaneously qualified to compete at a single event at this elite level.

“It’s a big deal, both for the school and for these athletes,” notes CVA Snowboard Program Head and Boardercross Coach, Alex Tuttle.

Tuttle, CVA alum '09, and successful Boardercross athlete himself, with an

X-Games silver-medal, podium finishes at the 2010 Junior World Championships and FIS World Cup, and champion at the 2008

USASA Nationals, can appreciate the dedication and tenacity it takes these young athletes to reach this level of competition.

He continues, “Performing well at a domestic World Cup means that an athlete could garner international starts on the circuit, selec-

tion to National Teams, and opportunity for exclusive training projects.”- Three of the athletes are in Post-Graduate years at the Academy: Devryn Valley of Gardiner, ME, currently ranked 7th in the U.S. for Snowboard Cross; Katie Wilson of Appleton, WI, currently ranked 10th in the U.S. for Snowboard Cross; and Haley Michienzi of Cape Cod, MA, currently ranked 11th in the U.S. for Snowboard Cross. The fourth athlete, Kiersten Edwards of Londonderry, VT, currently ranked 8th in the U.S. for Snowboard Cross, will graduate from CVA in June of 2017.

During the competition, Katie Wilson made it to the team race rounds.

News From Maine Huts & Trails



Great food and cozy surroundings await you.

We are enjoying one of our best seasons ever. The trails are just right for Nordic skiing, snowshoeing,

and fat tire biking. This winter, we are looking forward to hosting cross country ski racers for the

9th Annual Adventure Ski Race & Tour, a point-to-point race/tour. This year's race will be held on Sun-

day, March 12, 2017 and will feature three distances: 20K, 35K and 55K. The 55K will start at

Grand Falls Hut; the 35K will start at the Long Falls Dam Road Trailhead (lodging package optional on 3/11/17); the 20K will start at Staten's Gravel Pit (near Flagstaff Hut) on Long Falls Dam Rd. All courses end at the Sugarloaf Outdoor Center. All 55K participants are required to stay at Grand Falls Hut the night before, due to the remote, early start.

The huts and trails are open to the public year-round at no cost to day visitors. On Saturdays and Sundays from 11:30-1:30, you can venture out to a hut for lunch. We sell soups, salads, and baked goods that are made from

scratch on-site, and there's a great selection of beer and wine. If you spend the night at a hut, all three meals are included in the price. For an extra fee, you can even have all your gear transported to the hut so you can pack light. Maine Huts & Trails is a non-profit organization based in Kingfield that operates 80 miles of multi-use recreational trails and four off-the-grid backcountry lodges. For more information, check out the website: www.mainehuts.org or visit the Kingfield office, open every day from 9-5.

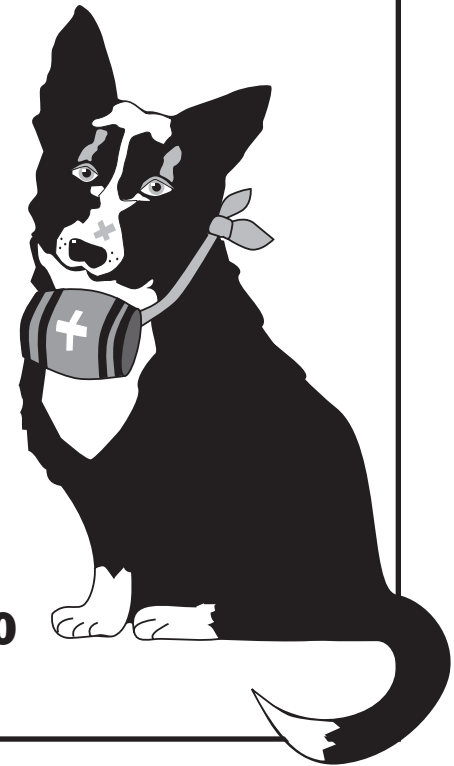

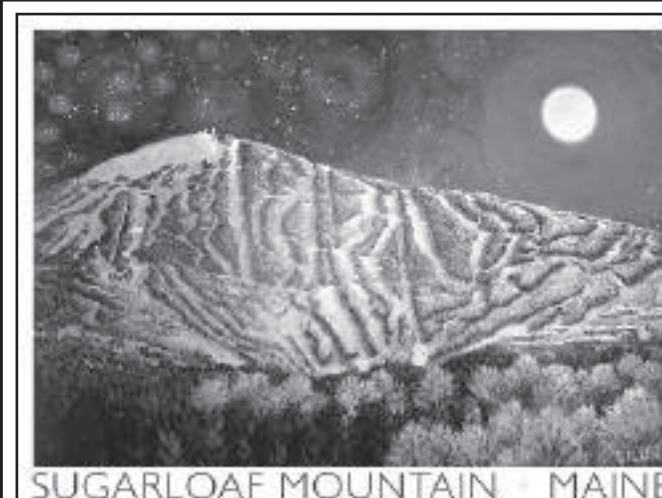
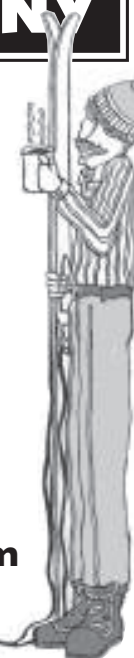
