He leaves behind his beloved wife Laurie (Jones) of more than 64 years, his daughter Krista Quinn (Chris) and his son






He was known for always being quick to lend a hand to anyone at any time.

There are currently 7 teams with over 130 locals racing on skis and snowboards.


On Jan 22, after 3 races. The Rack is in first place. Followed by The Red Pony, The Bag,

This fund was established to help our program kids with their travel expenses to out of region competitions. The better you get at any sport , the more expensive it becomes. This is very true in Snowsports.

This year on President's day, Feb. 17, 2025 during the Club's 75th Aniv. year, we will have our 43rd annual ski race and BBQ to honor the memories of Sugarloafers Dan McKay and Mike Waddle, two former members of the Sugarloaf Junior Racing Program who passed away at an early age. Mike in a commercial fishing accident and Dan doing what he loved most, back country skiing.

This event is not only a great fund raiser, but also a good time to be had by all. The race course is fun and forgiving and racing is an option, not mandatory for participants to race.

McKay/ Waddle funds will be used for merit scholarships, ski & snowboarding competitors who have excelled in their sport and have qualified for out-of-division competitions or been invited to attend high level invitation only camps run by USSA or USASA. No geographic restrictions on applicants. These awards are given out in the Spring as part of the Sugarloaf Ski Club Merit Award program. We have budgeted \$20,000 to be given out this year and this event is an important annual fundraiser for it. Over the years, we have awarded \$100,000 plus to deserving athletes.

The McKay – Waddle scholarship is just part of our \$96,000 budgeted this year to help local kids learn to and excel at skiing and snowboarding. The club's mission is to

help ensure that local kids are not denied the opportunity to learn to ski or snowboard because of financial considerations.

In 2018 we launched a new program with a generous \$500,000 gift from the H. King and Jean Cummings Charitable Fund. This gift isthe foundation of an endowment fund (now at \$1.3 million) for the King's Kids initiative to help kids ages 5-15 in Franklin and Somerset counties learn to alpine ski, snowboard, and nordic ski and to support other local initiatives. Sixth season accomplishments

Winter 2024 King's Kids funded the following:

 Kids from RSU 58, RSU 74, Stratton, and Rangeley participated in the 8-Sunday PM Boomuager program through the Sugarloaf Perfect Tum Ski School. King's Kids underwrote over 75% of the cost of this program, including <u>lift ticket, lessons</u>, <u>and</u> <u>rentals</u>, Each child only paid \$40 for the entire 8 session program.

- King's Kids assisted the Titcomb Mtn. Ski & Snowboard programs
- All volunteer run Baker Mountain in Moscow and Spruce Mountain in Jay were given funds by King's Kids..
- Many local children received scholarshipsto Sugarloaf Mini & Bubblecuffer programs (in addition to significant monies from other club funds).
- We awarded several thousand dollars to Stratton and Mt Abram Schools to help with middle and high school ski teams.

For 2025 season:

We have the Boomauger Jr.pro program. This program is designed to train 14-15 year olds to become instructors of skiing or snowboarding. The Boomauger program pro, vides local kids with 8 days of skiing or snowboarding lifts, lessons and rentals at the low cost of just \$40 for all 8 sessions. Nordic Boomaugers is only \$8King's Kid's had a verysuccessful fifthseason

Last year "SuperSquad" was a group of 12 amazing young Sugarloafers led by Captain JJ Sevigny Collectively they raised over \$59,000 for WinterKids. This put them in first place for "Kid's teams" and second place overall in funds raised. The Sugarloaf Ski Club is so grateful to these young Sugarloafers for putting in the hours to participate in a very important event. While it is a lot of fun, the event is so important to the Ski Club's mission of helping local youth be able to afford to ski or snowboard. The club got to keep half of the \$59k that was raised by the team and WinterKids also awarded us \$10k to help us with our programs. The club was involved heavily in the DH24 supplying many volunteers to help with running the event. Last year's DH24 raised more than \$970,000.

Special thanks go to our 3 moms, Jamie, Megan, Lindsay and grandmom Suzanne for all the work they put into this adventure.

Four of our team members, James, Gavin, Peter and Thomas skied all 24 hours. Our Captain, JJ, earned the Silver Boot for being the second highest individual fundraiser, raising over \$39k. Those accomplishments greatly helped the point tallies. When the "Kids Cup" winner was determined, SuperSquad came out on top.




