# King's Kids Initiative had a great first winter!

For years, your Sugarloaf Ski Club has provided significant scholarships and

funding for local kids to participate and excel in skiing and snow-

summer we launched a new program with a generous \$500,000 gift from the H. King an Jean Cummings Charitable Fund. This gift is the foundation of an endowment fund for the King's Kids initiative to help kids 15 and under in Franklin and Somerset counties learn to alpine ski, snowboard, and nordic ski and to support other local initiatives.

#### First year accomplishments

The fund is with the Maine Community Foundation, and with first years' earnings, King's Kids funded the following:

 61 kids from RSU 58, Stratton, and Rangeley participated in the 10-Sunday PM Boomuager program through the Sugarloaf Perfect Turn Ski School. King's Kids underwrote 70% of the cost of this program, including lift ticket, lessons, and rentals,

- King's Kids rented Titcomb Mountain in Farmington for a Friday free ski night, with discounted rentals
- Baker Mountain in Bingham and Spruce Mountain in Jay were given funds by King's Kids to reduce lift tickets for kids to \$5 during February vacation.
- 16 local children received \$100 scholarships to Sugarloaf Mini & Bubblecuffer programs (in addition to significant monies from other club funds).
- The after Ski & Skate Programs in Kingfield, Stratton, Strong, and Phillips each received \$500 to defray their expenses.
- The Sugarloaf and Rangeley Middle School Ski Teams received support.

# With your help we can do a lot more.

All told, just under \$20,000 from the King's Kids Fund earnings supported these programs. We expect – and want all these programs to expand, with more kids taking advantage of them. We are well on our way to raising an additional \$250,000, with a goal of \$500,000, to add to the endowment fund for a total of \$1,000,000.

Your help will enable us to commit up to \$40,000 annually to these King's Kids initiatives. "My first-grade son is enrolled in the Boomauger program and I'm writing to thank you for the incredible opportunity you've given him and other local kids this year. # 2019 Maine Ski Hall of Fame Induction to be held at Sugarloaf

The Maine Ski Hall of Fame was established as a division of SMOM to recognize individuals who bring distinction to Maine skiing through competition, either as athletes or coaches. The Hall also honors those who pioneered the sport in Maine: ski makers, ski area builders, instructors, volunteers and others who have made a significant contribution to the sport. This incoming class will bring to 144 the number of those honored. Four members of the Sugarloaf community will be inducted this year.


Billy Chenard began his Nordic career skiing with the Chisholm Ski Club. A member of the Eastern Junior National Team, he won the National Junior Nordic Combined title in 1972, and was named to the U.S. National Team. Billy gave back to his sport by developing the Nordic trails at Sugarloaf and the Balsams, which are considered best in the East.

Don Fowler has not only demonstrated a love of skiing by being on the mountain every possible day, but also by being an ambassador for the sport. A founder of the Ski Museum of Maine, Don has donated many hours as

Paul Schipper started his "Streak" of skiing every day Sugarloaf was opened from 1981 until 2005, regardless of weather, his health or obligations. As a retired airline pilot, he was a keen weather observer and reported to the marketing department after his runs. He certainly earned his rank as a legend at Sugarloaf.

Seth Wescott is one of the most accomplished and decorated athletes in snowboarding history. He was the first Olympic Gold Medalist in snowboardcross (SBX) 2006 at Turin, and successfully defended his title in 2010 at Vancouver. Seth divides his time between designing snowboards for his company, Winterstick and advocating for WinterKids and Take it Outside. He and works with other outdoor athletes at Protect Our Winters.






Congratulations to Freeride Team members Ben Malone(left), and Osten Duncan (right)! Out of more than 2000 freeride competitors, Ben and Osten have been invited to compete at this year's North American Freeride championship at Kicking Horse Resort. Every year this competition brings together the top 1% of IFSA competitors from across North America to test their skills on one of North America's most challenging faces. This year is no different: Ben and Osten will be competing on the Ozone face, the same course as this year's Freeride World Tour. The face drops 384 meters at an average pitch of 44 degrees. Cliffs from only a few feet to over a 100 stripe the face. The face is a favorite venue of the riders on the FWT for the variety of terrain, the steepness and the challenge. 
